# Message from the Executive Headteacher

As we head towards a well-deserved Christmas holiday, it is important to note that this is the first full Autumn term in school over the last 2 years due to the Covid 19 pandemic. Our students have responded so positively to being back in school and especially our new cohort of Year 7 students, who have now fully settled in.

The school is now offering a vast range of trips and visits that provide the diverse experience that all of our students rightly deserve. Our enrichment offer will continue and we are acutely aware of the current financial challenges we are all facing. We have made it clear that we will endeavour to make sure that our trips, moving forward, are offered so everyone can access them, and that we will look at extending the payment schedules where possible.

I had the privilege to meet many of our KS3/KS4 students at our reward breakfast this term; we started these breakfasts we have seen the numbers grow and grow and this reflects how hard our students are working at all levels.

Year 8 finish the term nearly at the half way point of Key Stage 3. This time next year they will be thinking about Key Stage 4 and which option subjects they wish to take. At this stage it is crucial that the year group understands the value of completing such a broad range of subjects and topics. We are very proud of our curriculum and want students to enjoy a variety of learning experiences and subject matter. It is through learning that students can develop traits like respect and integrity; all vital to society. Year 8 is a year when students can truly immerse themselves in learning and develop a foundation of knowledge that will set them up beyond school.

Feedback from teachers has been hugely positive and we are delighted to see Year 10 students working hard and prioritising their studies. The harder they work now, the better prepared they will be for Year 11 and the challenges of the final year. It is also impressive to see so many Year 10 students maintain their commitment to extra-curricular activities. The Key Stage 4 workload is significant, so to see Year 10s manage their time so well and keep commitments in sports and clubs is testament to their dedication. For all students, engagement in activities outside of the classroom is key to a healthy balanced life and we encourage students and families to monitor the website for clubs and opportunities they might be interested in.

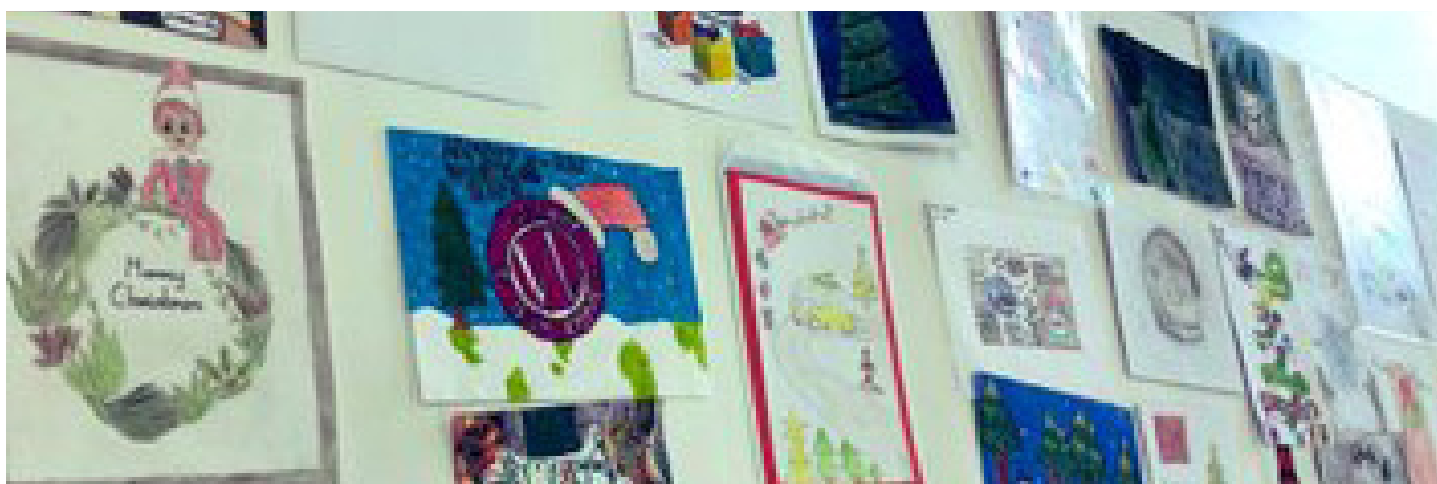
# Christmas card design competition

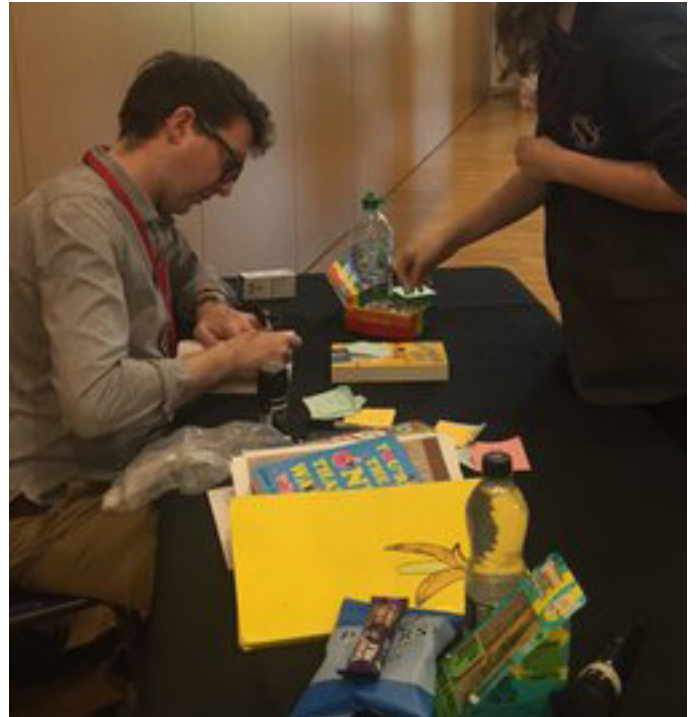


# Shoreham Academy book signing LRC trip with Simon James Green

# Diversity

**Research shows how important it is for young people to see themselves on the pages of the books they read, and how important books can be for building empathy with people who are different from ourselves.**

We're adding more books than ever to our library that focus on characters with non-white racial backgrounds; with disabilities; of different sexualities; and gender identities. We're also seeking out more books by authors with these identities/ characteristics themselves, so the books are as authentic as possible, and students hear from a variety of different voices.

# Worthing High School's visit to Bowers and Wilkins

On Tuesday 6 December and Thursday 8 December Mr Rasarathnam and Mr Allen took their Year 10 Design GCSE students to Bowers and Wilkins as part of their GCSE course. They were greeted by three members of the senior team and taken on a tour of one of the UK's premier speaker manufacturers.

The tour involved students seeing each stage of the manufacturing process, from a piece of veneer to a finished product.

Each stage was fully explained and involved opportunities for students to investigate and understand each process involved. Processes such as creating man-made ply wood, the forming process over moulds, the use of robotics in preparing surfaces prior to spraying and the final painting process.







Part of the tour involved students witnessing hand built components being made and tested before installation. They also saw how health and safety for the workers played a great part in the company's policy for looking after the welfare of their staff, as well as the morale of all staff. In addition to this they witnessed the equal opportunities for both sexes in the workplace and potential for women to progress as an engineer in this modern world.

Having toured the factory to see how it operates, the students were treated to a sound experience in the company's own R&D studio.

This experience reinforced the student's appreciation of the quality of the products B&W speakers create first hand. This was rounded off with light refreshments and biscuits.

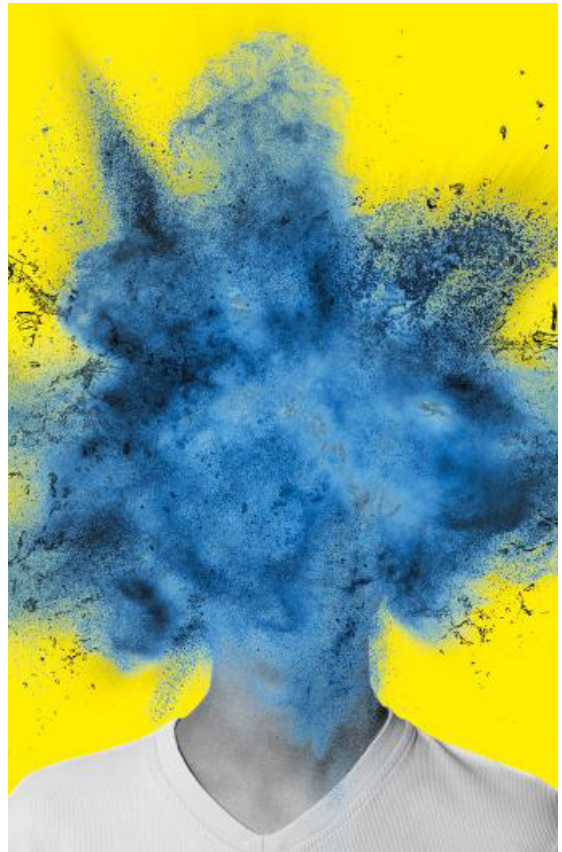
# Brainstorm

This year's summit had the theme – Mobilise! A call to action. The Green Team attended the summit for an afternoon of workshops, discussions and activities. The event started with a very interesting presentation from Henri Brocklebank, Director of Conservation Policy and Evidence at Sussex Wildlife Trust, who talked to us about the growth of kelp off the Sussex coast and its vital importance to the marine ecosystem.

We then attended workshops including; the decarbonisation of Shoreham Port, looking at food waste for Surplus Sussex charity and investigating the South Downs with the South Downs National Park.

We finished the Summit with a debate where we discussed whether we should invest in more public transport or electric vehicles.

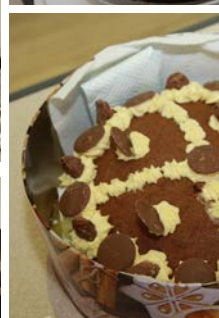
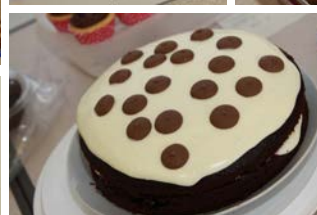
